#### Apr 10-12

### **3-Day Embedded Systems Workshop - Dept. of ECE**

A special three-day workshop on Embedded Systems was organized for the students of the ECE Department at RGUKT-BASAR. The program was conducted by a startup company called Sense Academia, founded by former students of IIIT Nuzvid, Andhra Pradesh. The sessions were led by Sudheer Sir, the CEO of Sense Academia, along with two experienced mentors.

The workshop was designed to give students hands-on experience with embedded systems by allowing them to code and run programs directly on hardware boards provided during the sessions. The department faculty and administration provided great support in successfully organizing this workshop.



On Day 1, students were introduced to the basics of the Internet of Things (IoT) and Embedded Systems. They also worked on simple LED-based projects, where they learned how to control LEDs by writing and running basic code.



On Day 2, the focus shifted to key topics such as timers, interrupts, and different types of registers. Students applied these concepts by building projects like traffic light controllers and patterned LED generation circuits.

On Day 3, students learned about ultrasonic sensors, UART (Universal Asynchronous Receiver-Transmitter) communication, and 7-segment displays. They completed practical projects using real hardware, such as the Cortex M3 development board, where they explored how sensors work and how data is communicated between devices.

Throughout the workshop, students received hands-on training and understood the importance of embedded systems in the modern tech world. It was a great opportunity for everyone to get exposure to industriallevel practices at the university level.

At the end of the workshop, Sense Academia also announced the Summer Industrial Training cum Internship Program - 2025, which will be organized in association with RGUKT-BASAR.



The workshop helped students build a strong foundation in embedded systems and opened doors for more advanced learning opportunities in the field. It sparked excitement among students to explore new technologies and better prepare themselves for future industry demands.

Overall, the three-day workshop was a great success, exposing students to the latest trends in embedded technology and giving them the confidence to work on real-world projects.

### From RGUKT to Bangalore: WattWise Wins Siemens Innovation Prize

Team WattWise from RGUKT-Basar made us proud by reaching the top 15 in the national-level **Tech For Society Hackathon 2025**, hosted by **Siemens and the Nasscom Foundation**. Competing against 700+ teams, they made it to the top 40 finalists and presented their innovative project on April 16–17 in Bangalore, at The Grand Ballroom.





The team— Salve Surya Raj(B21),Enugula Venu(B21), Gulimi Keerthi(B19) and Maddirala Ruchitha(B19); all are from CSE dept.-built an AI-powered platform called WattWise that helps optimize energy usage. Using XGBoost, TensorFlow, and React.js, they created a smart solution that impressed judges with both tech and design.

Surya Raj crafted a clean and modern UI/UX, Keerthi delivered a confident 7-minute pitch, Venu explained the AI model's working, and Ruchitha skillfully handled the 3-minute Q&A session. After intense sprints and reviews, the results were announced and Team WattWise bagged the Siemens Innovation Prize Box, placing them among the top 15 winners.

The team now plans to develop this project into a green tech startup, turning energy forecasts into real impact. Their journey shows how passion, teamwork, and innovation can spark real change.

### **RGUKT Students Excel at "Sankalp 1.0"**

Students from RGUKT Basar made their mark at the national conference Sankalp 1.0, hosted by SGGSIE&T, Nanded in collaboration with Godavari Drugs Limited. The event hosted enlightening lectures by renowned speakers such as Mr.S.Bharathan, Director of Refineries at HPCL, Mr. Maulik Mehta, CEO & Executive Director of Deepak Nitrite Ltd., and Prof. Genki Yoshikawa, Group Leader at NIMS, Japan.

Additionally, workshops on OPEN FOAM and ANSYS provided hands-on learning experiences, enabling students to gain practical insights and enhance their technical knowledge.
