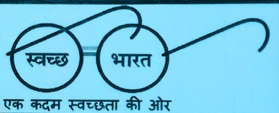

Research Fellowships and Publications:

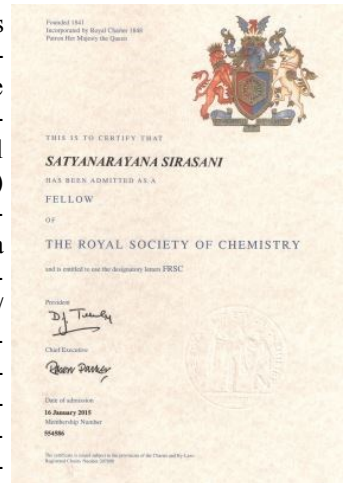
Professor Satyanarayana has got

Graduation CAPS ON

– RGUKT's maiden Convocation Ceremony



The first-ever convocation of Rajiv Gandhi University of Knowledge Technologies (RGUKT) was held at the International Convention Centre at Madhapur, Hyderabad on 4th August, 2014.

RGUKT was started as a full-fledged university by the State government in March 2008 by an Act of the State Legislature. The first batch of 6,500 students passing SSC were admitted into six-year integrated B.Tech course (a two-year pre-university course equivalent to Intermediate and four-year engineering course) in August 2008 in the three IIITs. The first batch students from 3 campuses successfully completed their graduation in 2014.

Most of the students who have completed their graduation registered for the convocation. Those who have attended the ceremony received their degrees. Others who were not able to attend received their degrees by post. The students who stood on the top with high score in their graduation were given gold medals.

Sri E.S.L Narasimhan Garu, the Governor of AP and TS, was the chief guest followed by Guest of Honor Sri N. Chandrababu Naidu, Hon'ble Chief Minister of Andhra Pradesh, Prof. Raj Reddy, Hon'ble Chancellor of RGUKT, Prof. R V Raja Kumar, Hon'ble Vice chancellor shared the dais with other members of RGUKT Executive Committee.



Hon'ble Sri E. S. L. Narasimhan delivered the inaugural convocation address of RGUKT. He delivered a great speech, and appreciated the work which is being done to provide the best education for the students. He offered his hearty felicitations to the successful students who were being conferred degrees and wished for their bright future.

He said, *“As the first batch of graduates from this university, you will set an example for the rest of the scholars to follow. You will become ambassadors of your alma mater and your sense of achievement will make it proud. Make this university which imparted values as well as education proud of you and be worth of its legacy”*



Hon'ble Sri N. Chandrababu Naidu congratulated the graduating students and said:

“You go out into the world and make your families proud, our state proud, and our country proud. I know that you are going to enrich the overall human experience on our dear planet. RGUKT received the 10th eINDIA award for IT in Higher Education category for its “ICT Based Hybrid Pedagogy.” Prof. R V Raja Kumar, Vice Chancellor - RGUKT received this award at a ceremony held at Kovalam, Kerala on 15th November, 2014 at the eINDIA summit 2014. RGUKT adopted this pedagogy and has successfully completed the education of 5,420 students of its first batch admitted in 2008. The Vice Chancellor congratulates every RGUKTian on this occasion.

RGUKT wins an award at the 8th NTA ICT World Communication Summit and Awards for outstanding contribution to rural education [2nd Award]

The university is being recognized for the second time at national level by the industry and academia for its innovative approach in higher education sector.



Rajiv Gandhi University of Knowledge Technologies (RGUKT) has won an award for outstanding contribution to rural education at the 8th NTA ICT World Communication Summit and Awards, which was conducted jointly by Association for promotion of Indian Telecom, Multimedia and IT Sector (CMAI), National Teachers’ Association (NTA) and National Education Association (NEA).

The event was held at Indian Institute of Engineering, Science and Technology (IEST) at Howrah, West Bengal on 11 Dec 14. Prof R V Raja Kumar, Vice Chancellor of the University received the award and delivered a key note speech at the summit. RGUKT is the only university in India to have provided high quality ICT based education at university level for the annual intake of 6000 students including 85% of rural students in the first two batches and to have graduated its first batch.

sive hurdle, which was somehow managed by the Technical people.

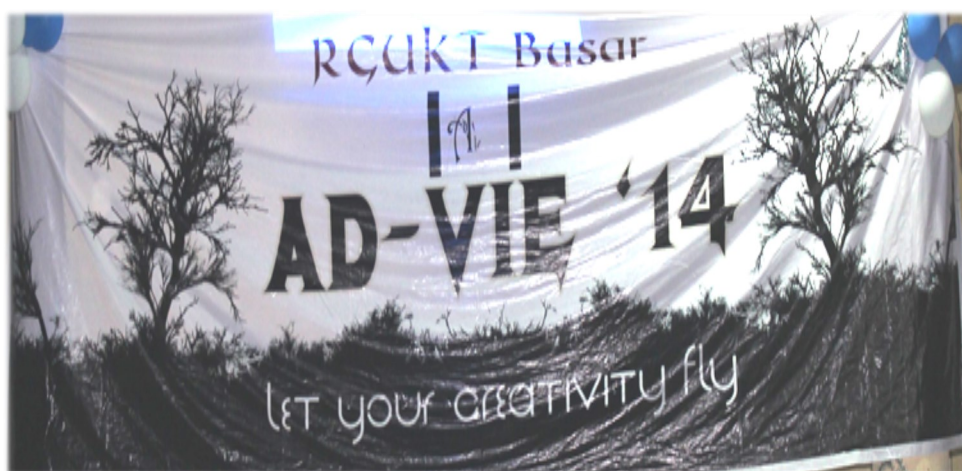

Swachh RGUKT

—The message behind the broom

Prime Minister Narendra Modi launched his nationwide cleanliness campaign, the 'Swachh Bharat Abhiyan' from Valmiki Basti in New Delhi on 2nd October 2014, the birth anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi. On this day, he first visited Rajghat, the memorial of Mahatma Gandhi and then headed to Valmiki Basti, a housing colony in the capital where sanitation workers live. There, Modi swept the streets as a symbolic start to the cleanliness drive. Addressing the nation at the launch, he asked India's 125 crore people to join the mission and promote it to everyone. He also flagged off a walkathon at Rajpath and surprised people by joining it not just for a token of few steps, but marching with the participants till the residence of former PM Atal Bihari Vajpayee, nearly 800 meters away. It's the start of a new broomance. Swachh Bharat Mission aims to get people to rediscover their roots, and leaves, and other discarded matter so they can make a clean break with the past.

In his address, Modi said the campaign was the best tribute to Mahatma Gandhi who gave us the message "Quit India, Clean India". He rued that Gandhi's dream was still unfulfilled and exhorted people to clean every nook and corner of the country. He stressed the importance of sanitation in many of his speeches. Roughly half of India's population do not have toilets at their homes, a health and safety problem that Mr. Modi has also vowed to fix.

He asked citizens to change their mindsets as cleaning is not only the responsibility of sweepers (or safai karamcharis), it is the responsibility of 125 crore Indian's. **"If Indians can reach Mars at a cheap cost, can we not clean our neighborhoods?"** The ambitious drive includes sweeping, removal of garbage, debris and unauthorized encroachments from the roads, markets and residential places.

The PM, on Independence Day made a clarion call of Swachh Bharat, a massive mass movement to create awareness of cleanliness and hygiene. He said that a clean India is the best tribute that we can pay to Mahatma Gandhi when we celebrate his 150th birth anniversary in 2019.

Yet, there is literally a mountain to climb and there clearly need to be specific targets.

With the same spirit, we have started this mission in our campus. It's main aim is to create awareness among the students to maintain a clean and hygienic surroundings, there by embellishing our campus. Swachh Bharat Mission was actually initiated and is being organized by the MME Department in our campus. Interested students and faculty (Ashok, Pradeep Santosh, Rakesh Roshan) of all other departments are also a part of this mission.

Let's have a walk in the campus from Academic Blocks - I & II, Brew berries, Sports ground and finally to the canteen.

What is the main thing that you focus while passing through these places? It's obviously all the chocolate wrappers, notebook pages, plastic covers, cool drink bottles and so on,

which not only stay at one place but drift from one location to other spreading over the dirt or waste over larger area. When it comes to dorms we can't even imagine the scenario because we know how beautiful our hostel corridors will be, especially on Sundays. Everyone try and keep their rooms or dorms clean, but throw or dump away all the wastage onto the corridor, but they forget that it's the same dust that enters into their room again. Not only this, but the population of mosquitoes will also increase day by day with the increase of dirt which in turn affects the students with many health issues.

Every Sunday this programme is being conducted near the girls hostel and the boys hostel. 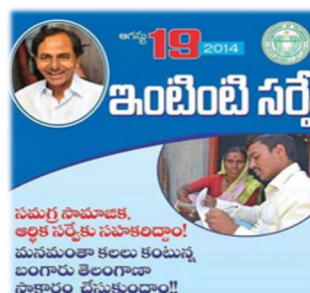
Intensive House Hold Survey

—Statistics of Telangana State

Telangana State, with a population of 35 million, was born after a 50- year separatist campaign. The Telangana government's initiative to carry out an "intensive household survey" is to weed out bogus claimants who are applying for government schemes. The survey is only an attempt by the Telangana government to exclude the names of people from Andhra Pradesh. The Government of Telangana has declared a public holiday on August 19, 2014 (Tuesday) in view of the Intensive Household Survey.

In support of their claim, they cited a previous draft survey question seeking information on the origin of the respondents. The Government set 1956 as the cut- off year to determine the nativity of the residents. The survey sought about the number of family members in a household, water tap connection, property tax assessment, LPG & electricity connections, bank account, Aadhaar card, caste certificate, birth certificate, disability, vehicles and lands owned.

The Telangana government has conducted this survey to have a rough understanding of the socio--economic status of households so that it would help them in implementing the welfare schemes effectively. All over the Telangana, 90 percent of families enrolled in the survey. The Government has announced a holiday on August 20 only for the staff (enumerators) who participated in the survey but later declared it a public holiday for all.



Role of IIIT Students in "Intensive Household Survey"

During the survey, the university has been closed for two days (August 19 and 20). Out of 7000 students, around 5000 students went to their homes to attend the survey.

On the order of district collector of Adilabad, our SWO, Bal Kishan requested the students to enroll as enumerators. The students were informed about this. Around 500 students enrolled as enumerators. The students were taken to their designated places by around 6 am in the morning on August 19. The students had to seek the information by asking survey questions between 7 am to 7 pm. The students enrolled around 6000 family details in the survey. Later the students were brought back to the university by 2 am on 20th August.

After the survey, the data entry of information which was compiled during the 'Intensive Household Survey' has started on Thursday. The Rural Development Officer (DRO) requested the students to compile and upload the data collected during the Survey. The authorities decided to deploy 180 computers and 400 students as data entry operators, shift wise to complete the process soon. The timings for data entry are from 3 PM to 11 PM. The students computerized the details of 10 mandals within 10 days. Above incidents show the IIIT student's dedication towards work. We can believe that IIIT students can serve their nation at any cost and at any time.

Interviewing the Interviewers

—A rapid Q & A Session with TCS Recruitment Team

The Student: *Sir, You have been here since yesterday. So, how is your 2-day stay at RGUKT - Basar?*

Interviewer_1: Yes, it was good. The food and accommodation provided were quite satisfying. But we didn't get some proper guidance as soon as we got here.

The Student: *Well, You may have visited many other colleges before coming here. What is the main difference that you have found between the outside students and RGUKT students?*

Interviewer_1: After interviewing these many students in this college, we have observed that the grade points of the students are quite good but they are not able to justify them. It seems like they study only for marks. And further, the students don't have much exposure to the subjects that they learn. Practical experience is lacking.

The Student: *What is the best thing that you have observed in RGUKT students?*

Interviewer_1: The students over here are very disciplined and they have a very good attitude.

The Student: *In what areas do we need to improve so that we can perform better in the subsequent years?*

Interviewer_1: You should try to know the end to end process of each and every thing. You also try to get updated about all the things. And also communication skills need to be improved a bit more so that you could present your knowledge better.

The Student: *What are the suggestions that you would like to give to students who will be attending for the interviews in the subsequent years?*

As you know currently your seniors are going through the TCS placements and we are also trying to get core companies for MME, CHEM, MECHANICAL and CIVIL branches. It is happy to note that written test results are quite encouraging and we are expecting good results from TCS. In the next few years you would also be facing the same.

From our side we are conducting mock tests, mock interviews to make you get ready for the real world scenario. But more efforts must be made from students. I would be glad to suggest you few things so that it might help you in your future endeavors.

- ⇒ You must try to overcome stage fear.
- ⇒ Don't just limit yourself to subject knowledge, go beyond what is there in curriculum and gather a lot of information in whichever field you choose.
- ⇒ Time management plays a key role in almost everything and one should have a clear-cut idea of what to do and when to do.
- ⇒ From second year itself you must start your preparation.
- ⇒ Prepare well for aptitude and reasoning, improvise logi-

Interviewer_1: We would just like to suggest you to improve communication skills and practical knowledge on subjects that you learn. Practice more of logical reasoning. Try to have a proper planning of your career. Be clear in your vision.

The Student: *What do you generally expect from a student when he/she comes for an interview?*

Interviewer_2: Generally, we don't expect anything from the fresher's. We just see whether the student is perfect in whatever he has learnt till now. Even if he/she is from non-IT background, we check their excellence in their own core subjects.

The Student: *What have you noticed in the students of this college?*

The Automated Flying Guests

— To Deliver at your Doorstep

Fed up with all the conventional stuff? So, let's look after a technology which could revolutionize the entire shipping & delivery services. When you see a post man or a courier boy knocking your door with a parcel, sometimes you might feel screwed up and sometimes pleased depending on its importance, but how do you feel when a completely new guest, something like a drone comes to your door with a parcel? First of all, you will be dazed and then pleased to see an innovative thing.

In last December, Amazon announced that it intends to deliver packages to customers using drones. But its "Amazon Prime Air" initiative, was widely ridiculed for being an over-hyped announcement with little to show for it.

This summer, Google demonstrated its own drone-based delivery service, using a fixed-wing aircraft to deliver packages including chocolate bars and cattle vaccines to farmers in Australia.

But now, German delivery giant DHL has beaten the tech firms to the post, announcing a regular drone delivery service for the first time, nine months after it launched its "parcel copter" research project in December 2013. The service will use an autonomous quad copter to deliver small parcels to the German island of Juist, a sandbar island 12km into the North Sea from the German coast, inhabited by 2,000 people. Deliveries will include medication and other goods that may be "urgently needed".

Flying under 50 meters to avoid entering regulated air traffic corridors, the drone takes a fully automated route to a dedicated landing area. It is a special air-transport container that is extremely lightweight as well as weather and waterproof.

There are still some hitches to overcome. Although the flight

is automated, the parcel copter will be "constantly monitored" by a ground station for safety reasons, and to ensure compliance with the regulations. The ground station will also liaise with air traffic control. Nonetheless, the company is taking orders for the parcel copter's regular flights, which islanders can place at the island's pharmacy. The scheduled flights will focus on times when conventional ways of delivering packaged, such as ferries and manned flights, are not available.



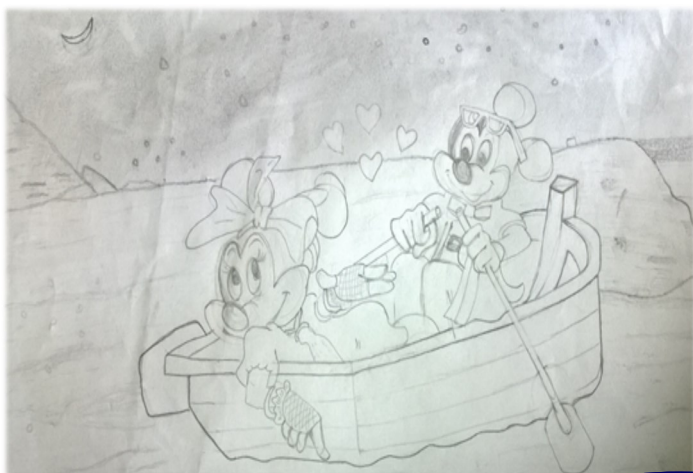
DHL parcel copter 2.0 is already one of the safest and most reliable flight systems in its class that meets the requirements needed to fulfill a mission. This additional service can create added value for the residents and visitors to the islands and other hilly regions where shipping or delivery is quite difficult. DHL's scheme is similar in practice to that explained by Amazon:

A small rotary-blade copter, carrying packages to and from locations which it delivers by landing. But in finding the niche, DHL has overcome several difficulties that Amazon faces in launching its own service: The copters do not have to navigate complex urban and suburban environments, nor do they have to deal with the possibility of vandalism or theft once they land.

Google, with its own prototype drone delivery service, has taken a different tack. Using a fixed-wing aircraft, the drone can fly further, faster; and it doesn't land at all to deliver the package, instead it lowers the items on a tether while it hovers.

Everything has pros and cons associated with it, even our parcel drones are not an exception. They can be misused sometimes like smuggling, terrorist activities etc., all the firms which are coming up with new ideas regarding these should come up with a drone which serves the needs of people and should not leave any space for its misuse.

Nature's Greatest Fury

Jammu & Kashmir has always been a vulnerable place in India. Kashmir people have seen many wars, faced many uncertainties, have always been affected with great casualties. But these seem to be nothing in front of the catastrophe which they faced off late. Their suffering increased as Jammu and Kashmir reeled under possibly the worst floods in nearly six decades, and as the toll in terms of lives, property and crops mounts. The extent of the deluge could be gauged from the fact that some 2,500 villages have been partially or completely submerged. Thousands of people were stranded on rooftops waiting to be rescued. So many people lost their loved ones. Many of them abandoned their dwellings, homes and their properties. They didn't have food to eat, water to drink, clothes to cover their body and to protect themselves from extreme winter. Floods have washed away everything that stood in its way.

The question that looms large is whether timely warnings had been issued and were measures initiated to let people take evasive action on time. Kashmir has been buffeted in successive years by serious floods in rivers that have their headwaters in the Himalayan mountain ranges. There was no warning issued before the water levels rose almost overnight along Jhe-



lum-the river that flows across the Kashmir. Although we have weather forecasting systems to predict such upcoming disasters, with the aid of technology, including real-time upstream monitoring mechanisms and space-based mapping process, have been laid in place, yet we face such tragedies often.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi made an aerial survey of the scene and termed it a "National-level disaster". State government led by Chief Minister Omar Abdullah, had a massive task to be tackled for which Government wasn't ready when the tragedy shattered all over Kashmir. Neither Indian government nor state government allowed any let up in their relief efforts.

It was like a war with the mother nature. The National Disaster Response Force was active on the scene, and the Army, the Navy and the Indian Air Force were at work. Jawans, without even caring their lives, saved many people, supplied water,



food, blankets and medication, etc. Every one across the globe was in a shock with this hair raising incident which shook the whole nation. NAMO - The Change

The 16th Indian general elections, held in 2014 from 7th April to 12th May in 9 phases, conducted in 543 parliamentary constituencies of India, was historic. The competition was mainly between Bharatiya Janata Party led National Democratic Alliance and Indian National Congress led United Progress Alliance.

The star campaigners for these elections were Narendra Modi, Rahul Gandhi, Mulayam Singh Yadav Jayalalithaa, Mamata Banerjee and Nitish Kumar.



Bharatiya Janata Party announced Narendra Modi as Prime Ministerial Candidate, as he was elected as Chief Minister of Gujarat for the third consecutive time, on behalf of NDA. He showed his power in developing Gujarat by utilizing human resources and power.

The results were declared on 16 May, fifteen days before the 15th Lok Sabha completes its constitutional mandate on 31 May 2014.

Congress led UPA swept out in the wave of BJP Prime Ministerial Candidate Narendra Modi. The National Democratic Alliance, led by the Bharatiya Janata Party, won a sweeping victory, taking 336 seats. After winning with a clean majority, BJP led NDA took the charge on 26th May 2014. As a genuine patriot and also as a dynamic leader, Shri Narendra Modi sworn in as new 15th Prime Minister of India. Within few months of his Presidentship, he has made many efforts in making a strong India. The major steps he has taken include:

1) Pradhan Mantri Jan Dhan Yojana (Prime Minister's People Money Scheme): It is a scheme for comprehensive financial inclusion launched by the Prime Minister of India, Narendra Modi on 28 August 2014. He had announced this scheme on his first Independence Day speech on 15 August 2014.

2) Swachh Bharat Abhiyan (Clean India Mission): It is a national campaign by the Government of India, covering 4041 statutory towns, to clean the streets, roads and infrastructure of the country. This campaign was officially launched on 2 October 2014 at Rajghat, New Delhi, where Prime Minister Narendra Modi himself cleaned the road. It is India's biggest ever cleanliness drive and 3 million government employees and school and college students of India participated in this event. This campaign aims to accomplish the vision of a 'Clean India' by 2 October 2019, the 150th birthday of Mahatma Gandhi. Swachh Bharat is not a one-day event but should be part of life, in order for the goal of a clean India to be achieved.



3) Make In India: It is an international marketing strategy, conceptualized by the Prime Minister of India, Narendra Modi on 25 September 2014 to attract investments from businesses around the world, and in the process, strengthen India's manufacturing sector. The campaign has been concentrated to fulfill the purpose of job creation, enforcement to secondary and tertiary sector, boosting the national economy, converting India to a self-reliant country and to give the Indian economy global recognition.



The major purpose of Make in India include making India a manufacturing hub and economic transformation in India while eliminating the unnecessary laws and regulations, making bureaucratic processes easier and shorter, and make government more transparent, responsive and accountable.

Purpose:

Job Creation, Enforcement to Secondary and Tertiary sector, Boosting national economy, converting the India to a self-reliant country and to give the Indian economy global recognition. He categorically declared that a bank account for each household was a "national priority".

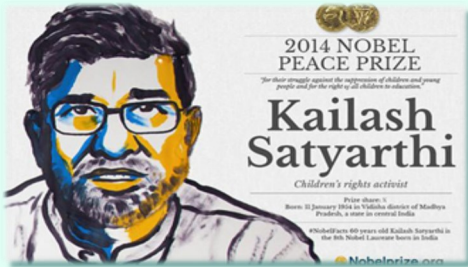
Nobody Knows Me

In the last two days, I have been addressed as Satyapati, Ashokji, Siddhanthji,” says child rights activist and Nobel Peace Prize laureate Kailash Satyarthi, laughing at his new-found celebrity.



He is the 8th Nobel Prize winner for India and only 2nd Indian winner of the Noble Peace Prize after Mother Teresa in 1979. He is an Electrical Engineer and after his post graduation, worked as lecturer for some years and then he gave up his career as teacher and became secretary general for the Bonded Labour Liberation Front. He also found Bachpan Bacho Andolan (Save the Childhood Mission). Satyarthi shares his prizes with Malala Yousafzai, the teenage activist from Pakistan. The Nobel committee heavily underlined the significance of “a Hindu and a Muslim, an Indian and a Pakistani” engaged in a common struggle for children’s rights and education. As on other occasions when the prize has been awarded in parallel, like Nelson Mandela and F.W. De Klerk, or Yasser Arafat, Yitzak Rabin and Shimon Peres, the committee is trying to strengthen

an impulse towards peace that it considers valuable. Now, beatified by the Nobel, Satyarthi explained his life’s work to a media scrum, preparing a face to meet the faces he meets. “I have been invisible because those I work for have been invisible,” says Satyarthi. He has spent the last 33 years in active combat against forced child labour-rescuing children, riveting attention to the conditions in which they worked, rousing corporations and consumers to this injustice, lobbying policymakers, filing petitions in court, and mobilising international opinion. Not so long ago, child labour was seen as a sorry fact of life in poorer nations. Like Malala Yousafzai, Satyarthi has faced life-threatening danger in this pursuit. Three of his colleagues, Adarsh Kishore, Dhoom Das and Kalu Kumar, have been killed. He faced many obstacles in his mission, yet he didn’t leave his ideals.



“This Nobel will change that notion in India, the sense that child labour is not such a big problem,” says Anil Khachi, joint secretary in the Union labour ministry. The number of working children has fallen hugely in the last decade, from 1.26 crore in the 2001 Census to 43.53 lakh in 2011. It is unclear, though, whether this is the result of legislation restricting child labour and making education compulsory, or of rising prosperity and dropping fertility, which obviates the tendency to put children to work. For all Satyarthi’s laser-like focus, poverty, education and child labour present several complex chicken-and-egg conundrums. **Hearty congratulations to him and salute to his thoughts.**

Hud -Hud

After dousing the repercussions of the 2004 tsunami and the 1977 cyclone, the “The Jewel of the East Coast” sadly had its date with Hudhud on 12th of Oct 2014 which tore through the city, causing a severe far-flung destruction and brought large number of people to a grinded halt. The name Hudhud (Arabic), which is means a bird in Quran and appears in the story of Sulayman (Solomon).



Hudhud was originated in the Andaman Sea on October 6, 2014 from a low pressure system formed under the influence of an upper-air cyclonic circulation. Hudhud intensified into a cyclonic storm on October 8 and as a severe cyclonic storm on October 9. Hudhud underwent rapid deepening in the following days and was classified as a Very Severe Cyclonic Storm by the Indian Meteorological Department (IMD). Shortly Hudhud crossed the coast of Andhra Pradesh near Pudimadaka, about 50 km from City of destiny with its peak strength. The system then drifted northwards towards Uttar Pradesh and Nepal, causing widespread rains in both areas and heavy snowfall in the latter.

Hudhud, strong winds and heavy rains led to large-scale disruption of power lines in the three costal districts of Andhra Pradesh. Several areas in the city plunged into darkness. On the communication front, except for mobile network with frequent call drops, the region was left with no other source. Many of the industries, public places, roads and great institutions were swiped out. All the people were left homeless and nearly 400,000 people have been evacuated to relief camps in five districts. The damage which has been roughly estimated as \$9.7 billion.

State government has taken relief measures to get through them which includes providing basic amenities for less cost, giving them temporary shelter, allotting 41 IAS officers to oversee relief measures, raised CM FUNDS, got initial central assistance of 1000 Cr., started many programs etc. Some of the relief measures by some reputed organizations include deployment of teams from the armed forces and NDRF, depletion of reservoirs to accommodate cyclonic rainwater, positioning of boats, swimmers and relief camps and standby systems to restore power and telecom services. Even many of private organizations raised their hands to help the victims of the affected districts through CM relief fund.

One of the top Telecom Service Provider, Airtel has set up a helpline number to help people know the last location of their friends and relatives in case they are affected by cyclone Hudhud approaching coastal area of Odisha and Andhra Pradesh. Hudhud victims have been given necessities like they could call 1948 and those in Andhra Pradesh could call 1949 to know about their missing friend.

On the behalf of these needy people, we collected funds from the students and faculty which has turned out to be a great effort from our side. Some officials said that it would take weeks for Andhra Pradesh’s largest city to get back on its feet after the unprecedented blow. May god bless for its faster recovery.

Mars Orbiter Mission

Today we have created history, India has achieved this incredible space glory even in the face of its adversities!!! This must inspire all of us! Indeed not only a lesson in space science but also conveying a moral lesson deeply meaningful to the mankind! Indeed feeling proud to the core!" said **Narendra Modi in his speech from ISRO (Bangalore successful insertion of 'Mangalyaan')**.

Now our country India joined the United States, European Space Agency and the former Soviet Union in the elite club of Martian explorers with the Mars Orbiter Mission, affectionately called MOM. Modi congratulates scientists at ISRO. "History has been created today," he says.

The five reasons why Mangalyaan was the cheapest Mars mission ever.

This morning has been a stupendous success story for ISRO, as Mangalyaan, its maiden Mars mission entered the orbit of the Red Planet. The five reasons why Mangalyaan was the cheap-



est Mars mission ever. The Mangalyaan entered the Martian orbit after a 300-day marathon covering 670 million kilometers. India's Mars mission represents a technological leap for our South Asian nation, pushing it ahead of space rivals China and Japan in the field of interplanetary exploration. Recent efforts by those countries to reach Mars have failed. Not only did India become the only nation to reach Mars on its first attempt, but also did it with the least amount of money. ISRO – Indian Space Research Organization spent around \$70 million on its maiden Mars mission, and while many argued this was a huge sum of money to be spent on such programs when a part of the nation still suffers in poverty, this figure is a small fraction of the \$671 million that the NASA spent on its latest Mars mission. Here's what made MOM the cheapest mission to MARS till date:

1. The space scientists at ISRO have always been used to working on a shoe-string budget. In its early days, space scientists worked out of an abandoned church near its first launch pad. Later, after India carried out nuclear-weapons tests, other countries refused to share their technical know-how, limiting India's access to sophisticated technology and relying on indigenous technology instead.

2. For Mangalyaan, ISRO used the technology it has used before, thus eliminating extra costs to develop new

technologies. What ISRO does successfully is build on its previous successive launch. The same modular approach was used with the payload as well, keeping it small and light at just 15 kilograms. ISRO saved on fuel by using a smaller rocket to jettison the spacecraft into Earth orbit first to gain enough momentum to slingshot it toward Mars.



3. Another key reason for the cost effectiveness of the Mangalyaan is the number of tests conducted by ISRO. These tests which are very time consuming and immensely expensive were kept to a minimum, but the results achieved in each of these tests was maximized.

4. The tight schedule on which the scientists worked helped in the frugal budgeting. Since the time it was announced by the then UPA government, it took a mere 15 months to liftoff. This is an achievement by all means. In fact, PM Narendra Modi has famously quipped that India has spent less to reach Mars than Hollywood producers spent on the movie "Gravity," which cost \$100 million to make.

5. The comparatively low salaries of the Indian scientists at ISRO also played a part in reducing the overall cost of the mission. The nations who have successfully placed missions in Martian orbit have all spent more than \$100 million on their attempts. In comparison to these nations, the salaries of their Indian counterparts are much less. Mangalyaan has cost India a meager Rs. 4 per citizen of the country.

MOM Success Meet in our college:

In our campus a success meet was organised commencing the successful launch of The PROUD, LANDMARK MANGALYAN mission by ISRO. Hon'. Director Prof. P.Appalanaidu along with the administration of RGUKT, faculty, mentors and students had a gathering in the ground, reviving the history of the launch, the effort of its team members in total congratulating ISRO people. Starting with the Director everyone spoke about the Mangalyaan mission, how they felt at its success, a mission which made every Indian Proud, gaining applauses from all the other nations in the world. It was actually a great opportunity to share our feelings where in students are given prime importance in dwelling their opinion.

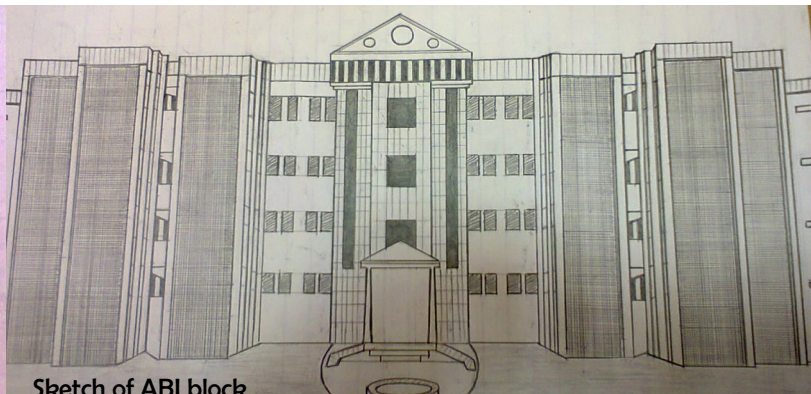

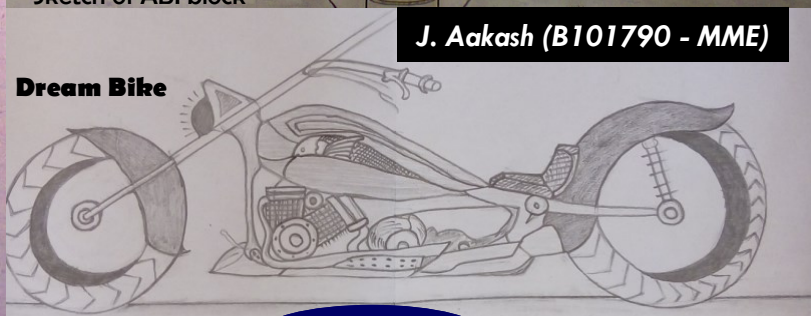

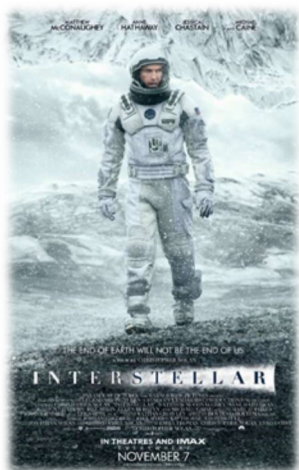

At the Exit, You will pose a question yourself, Am I forgetting to mount up back into my world?

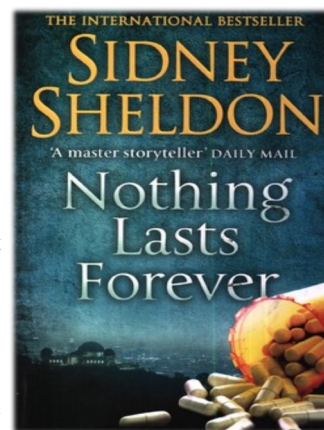

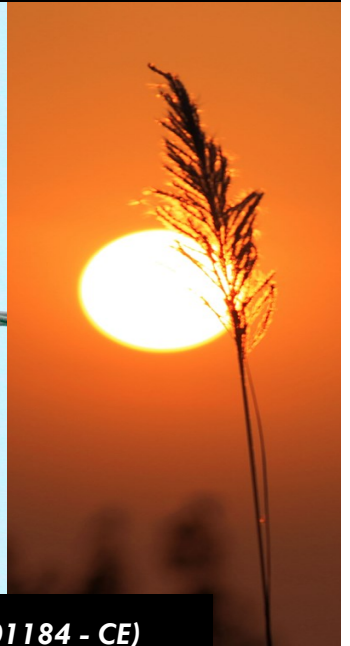
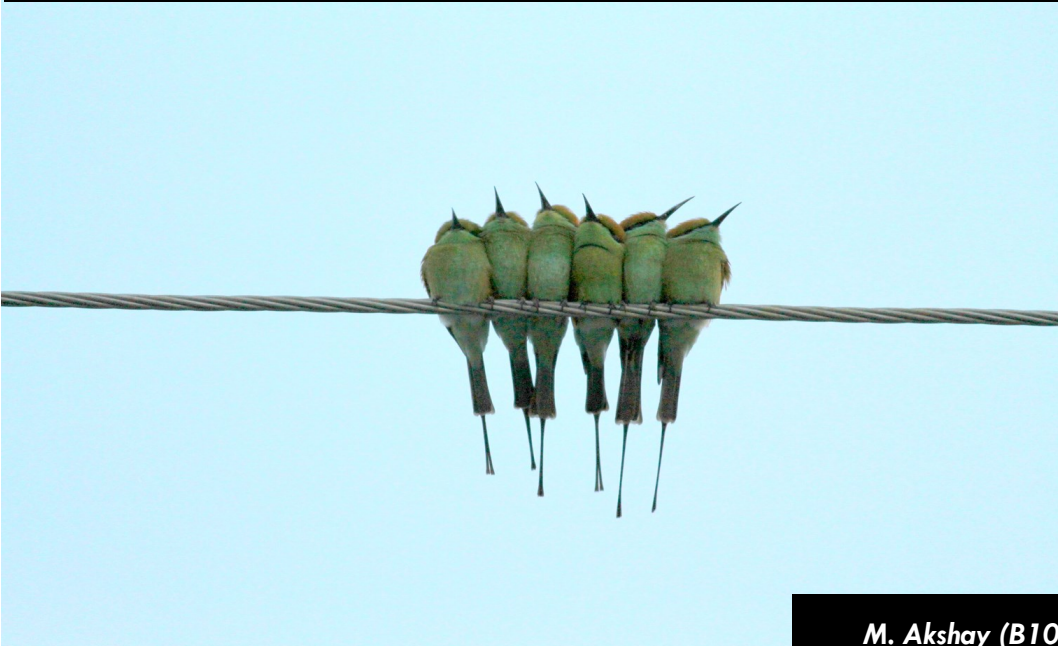
